Mike Leach is the Long Snapper for the Arizona Cardinals. He attended Jefferson Township High School in Jefferson Township, N.J., where he was a first-team All-State selection as a punter. In basketball, Leach graduated as the all-time leading scorer and rebounder in Jefferson Township High School history. Leach attended Boston University (1995–1997) and The College of William & Mary (1998–2000). During his junior season, Leach earned AP second-team All-America and second-team All-Atlantic 10 honors. As a senior, Leach earned first-team Walter Camp All-American honors at tight end as a senior. Mike was signed by the Tennessee Titans as an undrafted free agent in 2000. He signed a three-year contract with the Cardinals as a free agent on 3/12/09 after spending the last seven seasons with the Denver Broncos. In 2008, Leach was a finalist for the Broncos' "Walter Payton Man of the Year" award.

Lynne Wood Dusenberry has been a part of the University of Arizona community for more than 30 years. A proud Wildcat, Lynne has served as legal adviser and University Attorney for her alma mater since 1979. In 2005, she was named Deputy General Counsel. Prior to joining the University of Arizona, Ms. Wood served on active duty with the U.S. Navy as a legal assistance officer and member of the Judge Advocate General's Corps in Pearl Harbor and San Diego. She also served for 20 years in the U.S. Naval Reserve's Judge Advocate General's Corps, retiring with the rank of commander in 1996.
